Academic Support Services

Location: Classroom 109, Wahlert Hall

The Academic Success and Retention Coordinator will discuss the wide-range of academic supports available to all students, along with the supports geared specifically towards academically rigorous courses traditionally taken during the first year. There will also be a discussion in regards to student retention and how students, families, and the campus community can work together to help the students thrive at Loras.

Center for Experiential Learning

Location: Classroom 110, Wahlert Hall

Hear from the staff members of the Center about the variety of opportunities in the areas of internships, service-learning, student employment, and study abroad which will enhance your student's curricular experience.

Question and Answer Session*

Location: Kehl Room, Alumni Campus Center

This session will cover various topics that will help your student be successful in the first year. You'll hear a current staff and student perspective.

Financial Literacy * (Required)

Location: Ballroom AB, Alumni Campus Center

Staff from the Financial Planning and Business Offices will help you understand the next steps in securing financial aid, completing a master promissory note and entrance counseling, and gaining access to online student account information, billing, and payment plans. Students should bring their laptops to this session. This will be a hands-on session with staff available to help you navigate the processes and to answer any questions you may have.

Life of a Student Athlete

Location: Ballroom D, Alumni Campus Center

Will your student be participating in an intercollegiate sport in their time at Loras? If yes, this session is for you! A member of the Athletics Department will provide basics related to balancing college life and life as a student-athlete. There will also be time allotted for questions and answers.

Parenting Your College Student*

Location: Classroom 143, Wahlert Hall

Yes, that's right, your child has a new role, a new label: college student. And being a parent of a college student may be a new title for you. In this session we'll discuss the joys and challenges associated with parenting a college student and provide parenting strategies so that you can better support your son/daughter in his/her quest for success and happiness in the first year of college.

Residence Hall Tours

Residence Life*

Location: Kehl Room, Alumni Campus Center

In this session, parents will get to experience what Residence Life is all about! They will learn about life inside the residence halls, who to contact if any issues arise, life with a roommate, our bedloft program, what to bring to campus & what to leave at home, and lots more!

Spiritual Growth
