

SAMPLE FOUR-YEAR PLAN FOR SECONDARY EDUCATION-With an Educational Endorsement in Instructional Strategist I 5-12

Updated: April 2011

Note: Admission to Teacher Education is usually gained after students have successfully completed EDU 200, EDU 205 and PSY 121. A GPA of 2.75, Virtus training, and successful completion of the CAAP (basic skills) test is required for admission. LIB 105, 110, 220, PSY 121, MAT 110, MAT 111, and the advanced general education categories AA, AC and AH must be competed with a grade of C or better. A GPA of 2.75 and the completion of all major coursework with a grade of C or better are required for admission to Student Teaching.

Students pursuing licensure at the secondary level must major in an approved content area. Students pursuing secondary licensure have an academic advisor in the content area and attend required meetings within the Education Division to stay on track with licensure coursework.
