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Graduation Rates - Undergraduate

In accordance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, Loras College is pleased to share with you the following information on the average graduation rates of our **2013-2017 cohorts** of full-time, first-time, degree or certificate seeking undergraduates.

The College tracks graduate rates of first-time, full-time degree-seeking undergraduates who enter the College during the fall term of each year. The rates represent the percentage of student who finish within a time equivalent to 150% of the standard length of their program (e.g. 6 years for a 4 year program). Cohorts of entering group have been formed each year. The graduation rates of these groups by gender and racial/ethnic background are presented in the following table.
