



Master of Arts in Disability Studies: Application Checklist (International Student)

Please note that unless you are already in the United States, Loras cannot issue an I-20 to any international student completing a fully online master's degree (such as this one). You may still be admitted into this program, but you would need to complete the degree from your home country.

- Admission criteria and eligibility information:**
 - Have earned at least a bachelor's degree by the time of enrollment. Students are eligible for this degree regardless of their undergraduate major.
- Graduate Program application:**
 - Please create an account and apply online at: https://lcadmission.loras.edu/portal/gr_app. There is no application fee.
- Current resume:**
 - Please upload your resume to the "Materials" section of your online application.
- Personal statement:**
 - The personal statement is a typewritten paper outlining your interests and professional goals (maximum of 2 pages double spaced). This statement is an integral part of your application. Please address the following information:
 - Why are you pursuing a degree in Disability Studies?
 - What experience do you have with disability and/or individuals with disabilities?
 - Is there an area of your life, either social, academic, professional, religious, etc. that you feel could be enhanced by studying disability? Why?
 - A significant portion of this program is devoted to action research. You will be expected to identify a need and create a plan to meet that need. Is there a specific area you are interested in?
 - How do you plan to utilize your degree in Disability Studies?
 - Please upload your personal statement to the "Materials" section of your online application.
- Unofficial transcript from each college/university you have attended, including undergraduate and graduate:**
 - Please upload unofficial transcripts to the "Materials" section of your online application. You do NOT need to send us copies of your official transcripts.
- Copy of your passport photo:**
 - Please upload to the "Materials" section of your online application.
- Official foreign credential evaluation report:**
 - The report must show the United States equivalency for academic credentials earned in other countries. Loras College accepts evaluations directly from either Educational Credential Evaluators, Inc. (<https://www.ece.org/ECE>) or Foreign Credits, Inc. (<https://www.foreigncredits.com/>). You should contact Graduate Admissions if you have already received a foreign credential evaluation report from an organization other than ECE or Foreign Credits.

□ **Proof of English language proficiency:**

- Applicants must submit one of the official test scores below (unless you have received a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university in Australia, Barbados, Canada, Jamaica, New Zealand, Republic of Ireland, Singapore, United Kingdom, or the United States). Proficiency scores must be sent directly to Loras College from the testing center and must not be more than 2 years old.
 - TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language)
 - Internet-based test – score of 80 or higher
 - Paper-based test – score of 550 or higher
 - IELTS (International English Language Testing System)
 - 6.5 or higher
 - ACT
 - 21 or higher on both English and Reading sections
 - SAT
 - 500 or higher on evidence-based Reading and Writing sections

Please note that you will be required to upload your resume, personal statement, unofficial transcripts, and copy of your passport photo before you can submit your online application. However, you may start the application and return to it at a later time to upload those documents. It does not all have to be completed at once.

Application deadlines:

Summer enrollment (preferred) – all materials due by May 1

Fall enrollment – all materials due by August 1

Spring enrollment – all materials due by December 1

Applications submitted after the deadline will be considered on an individual basis.

Admission decision:

Immediately following receipt of all application materials, your file will be reviewed by the Director of Graduate Admissions. You will then be notified of an admission decision in your online Applicant Status Portal within one week.
